COVID-19 SCREENING UPDATE

Due to the high demand for COVID-19 tests, Virginia Garcia will only provide screening for established Virginia Garcia patients or individuals who work as migrant or seasonal farmworkers.

If you want to be screened for COVID-19 at a Virginia Garcia clinic you must first schedule an appointment. If you are a patient or work as a migrant and seasonal farmworker and would like to schedule an appointment at one of our clinics, please contact the clinic nearest you. Please do not come to a clinic without an appointment.

If you are not a Virginia Garcia patient, but would like to become one, please contact Member Services at 503-359-5564, option 3 to establish care. A telehealth visit with a Care Team is required prior to a COVID-19 test.

Free COVID-19 screenings and flu vaccinations are available to the public at our community outreach events taking place around Washington and Yamhill counties. You do not need to be a patient and no appointment is necessary to receive care at these events.
